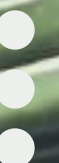

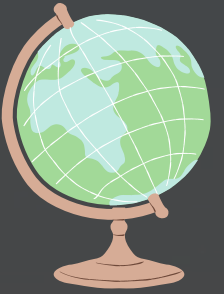

Painting: Balinese painting has its roots in ancient shrine panels and illustrated astrological calendars.



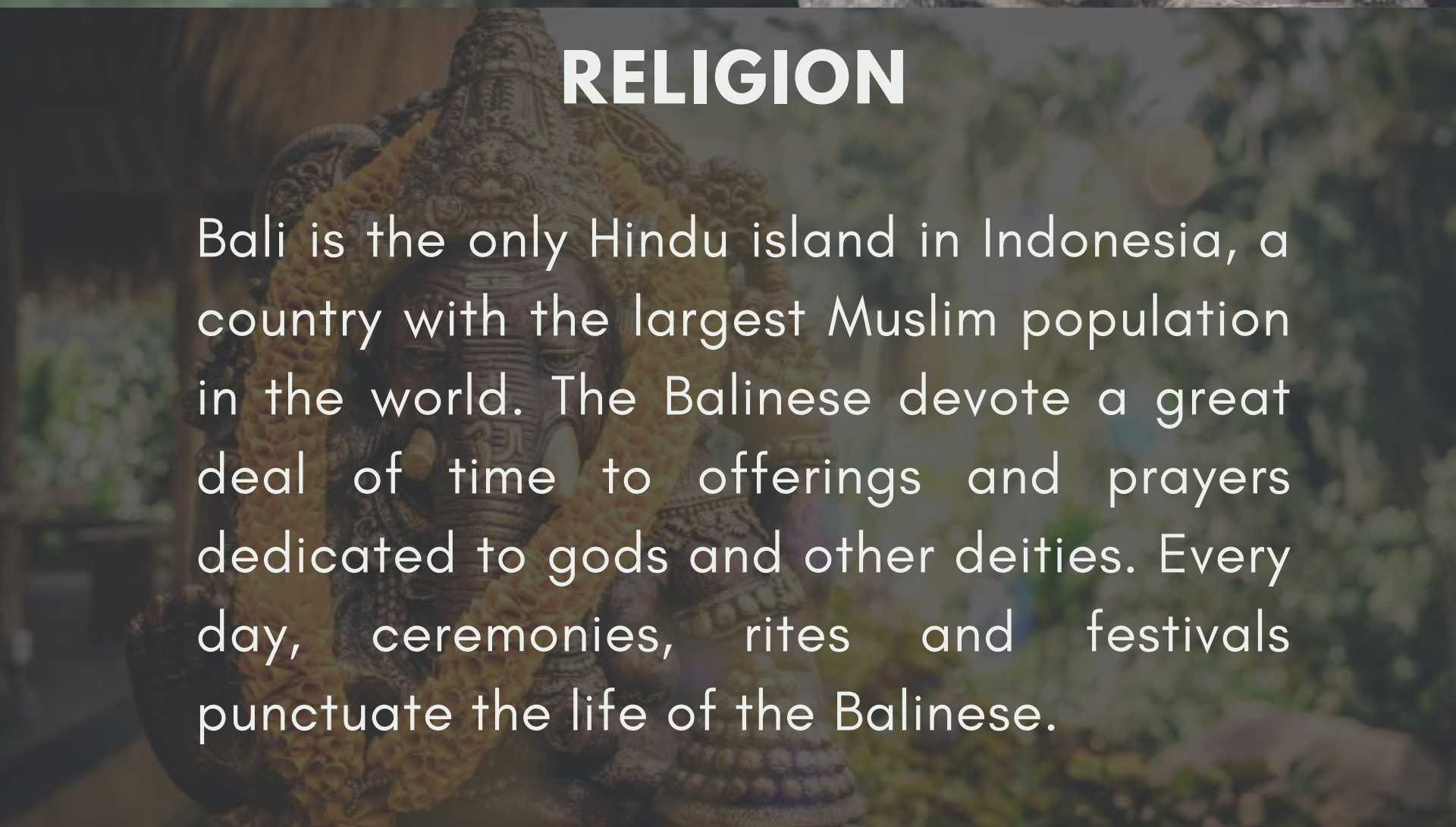
HISTORY

THE BEST TIME TO VISIT BALI

F BALI'S CLIMATE IS TROPICAL. PREFER THE MONTHS OF MAY, JUNE, JULY, AUGUST, SEPTEMBER AND OCTOBER DURING THE DRY SEASON WHICH RUNS FROM APRIL TO OCTOBER. AVOID THE WINTER MONTHS OF DECEMBER, JANUARY AND FEBRUARY AS THIS IS THE RAINY SEASON.



ENJOY THE BALINESE GASTRONOMY

Gastronomy in Bali is mainly Indonesian with Chinese and Indian influences, making the local cuisine rich in flavors, spices and colors. This unique cuisine uses mainly fresh vegetables, meat, fish and lots of spices and herbs. As rice is grown on the island, it is widely used in many recipes and is often combined with pork or chicken, but as Bali is a Hindu island, beef is never or very rarely eaten.

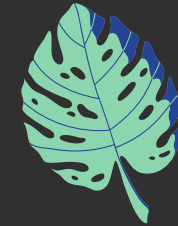

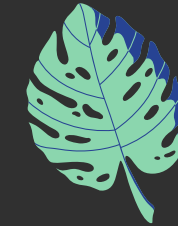

Transfer in air-conditioned vehicle with your French speaking driver.

Arrival at **UBUD**

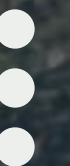
Ubud, located on the highlands of Bali in Indonesia, is a city famous for its handicrafts and traditional dances. The rainforest and rice terraces dotted with Hindu temples and shrines surrounding the Ubud district are among the most famous landscapes in Bali. Ancient shrines include the temples of Tirta Empul, Goa Gajah ("Elephant Cave") with its fine carvings, and Gunung Kawi with its rock-cut shrines.

The town was initially an important source of medicinal plants and herbs. The name Ubud comes from the Indonesian word ubad, meaning medicine.

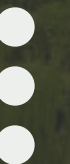
Departure to attend the Barong dance. The Barong dance which means giant or called kriss dance is one of the most famous in Bali, narrating the fight between good and evil. This dance is a classic example of the Balinese bringing their mythology to life, creating their reality from a mixture of myth and history.

Continuation with a visit to the Goa Gajah Elephant Cave in Bedulu. The façade of the cave is a sculpture of various creatures and threatening demons. The mouth of a monster serves as the entrance to the cave. A statue of Ganesh, the god of wisdom, intelligence, education and prudence, the patron saint of schools and knowledge workers, can be seen in the cave, as well as three statuettes representing Shiva's lingams.

Lunch in a village and help prepare the meal with a typical family. You will taste local Balinese products.

Afternoon, visit the temple of the sacred spring of Tampak Siring and the royal tombs of Gunung Kawi and Tegallalang Rice Terrace. **You will have the opportunity to learn how to plant rice in the famous rice fields with a professional. You will share a convivial moment of exchange and exchange.**

Dinner at a local restaurant & Back to the hotel



DAY 3

UBUD – LOVINA

Breakfast.

Departure to **Bedugul via Mengwi** (the royal temple of Taman Ayun).

Visit the village market of **Candi Kuning** and Ulun Danu temple, dedicated to the goddess of Lake Bratan. Lake Bratan is the second largest lake in Bali and is located in the Bedugul area. On this lake was built the Ulun Danu Beratan Temple in 1663 for the Balinese to come and deposit offerings during ceremonies dedicated to the goddess of water: Dewi Tanu.

Ulun means "power" and Danu Beratan means "Lake Beratan", so it is an association with the famous goddess. Lake Bratan is also known in Bali to be the main source of water for the centre of the island.

Lunch at a local restaurant.

Continuation to **Lovina** and stop en route to visit **the Git Git waterfall**.

Lovina is a seaside resort located on the north coast of Bali, Indonesia. It is famous for its black sand beaches, coral reefs and dolphins.

DAY 4

LOVINA - CANDIDASA

This morning, and before breakfast, you will leave for a sea walk to see the dolphins.
Breakfast at the hotel

Departure to Singaraja, the former capital of Bali.

Continuation to the Kintamani region to admire the beautiful landscape of Mount Batur and the volcanic lake of the same name. Mount Batur is the second highest volcano in Bali at 1717 meters high. It is marked by its broken ridge and still maintains an important activity. Two eruptions will always remain engraved in the minds of the Balinese: in 1917, the village of Batur was completely decimated, and in 1926, a second boiling forced the inhabitants and their temples to move to the cliffs of Kintamani.

Lunch at a local restaurant opposite Mount and Lake Batur.

You will go down to the east of the island to visit the Besakih temple. Besakih is known to be the "mother temple" of Bali, so it is the most important temple of Balinese Hinduism and is located 1000 meters high, not far from Mount Agung. The discovery of Besakih temple is worthwhile because there are many steps to climb but the view from the top is worth it. Visit the village of Tenganan, a village of Balinese aborigines who still live according to the traditions. Installation at the hotel in Candidasa.

Dinner and overnight at the hotel.

DAY 5

CANDIDASA – SANUR

Breakfast at the hotel.

Departure for a trekking of about 1h30 to the village of Kastala, where you will pass villages, gardens and rice fields.

Lunch in a local restaurant.

Departure to the South of the island.

Visit of the bat cave (the Goa Lawah) and the old courthouse of Kertagosa in Klungkung. East of Bali in the Klungkung area you will find the Goa Lawah (bat cave) which is located not far from Kusamba where salt is harvested. It is a cave dug deep into the mountain with thousands of bats. Don't misunderstand this place and its temple are very important to the Balinese!

Goa Lawah has a temple at its entrance which is considered to be one of the most important in the island as it is one of the 9 directional temples of Bali. It would be designated as a sacred place to honor the god Maheswara who resides in this area of the island. When the Balinese are passing through the area they go to this temple to pray and make an offering.

Offer elsewhere travel: 1 hour massage offered in a spa.

After the massage, transfer to Sanur. The sublime beaches of Sanur are real little corners of paradise, a dreamlike vision of all that Bali has to offer to holidaymakers. More relaxed than other nearby resorts, Sanur is the very type of place that European night owls choose when they are tired of parties too wild to recharge their batteries.

Transfer to Benoa.

Dinner and overnight at the hotel.

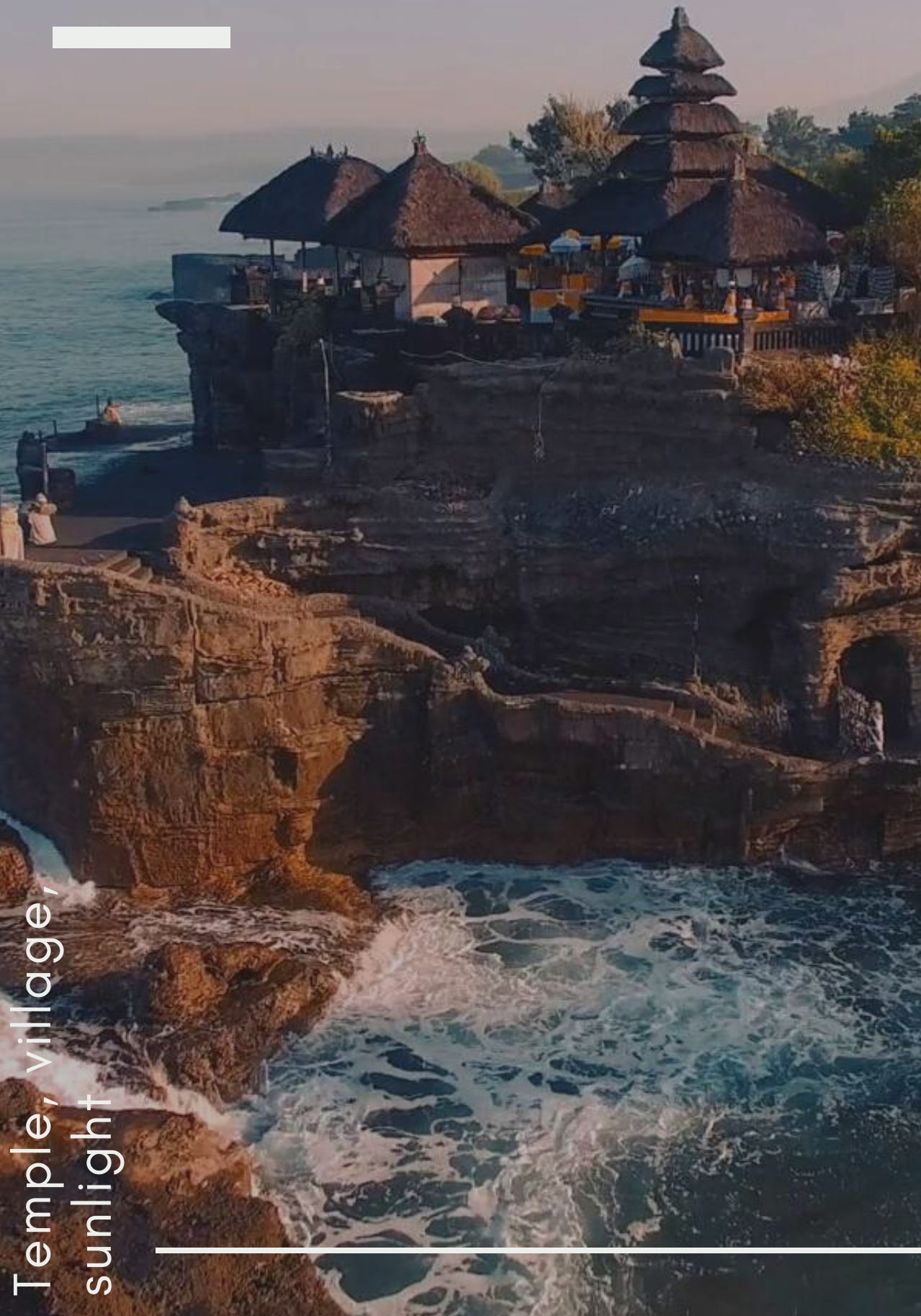

DAY 6

SANUR

Breakfast at the hotel

Departure to the Balinese agricultural village of Tabanan.

During this tour you will learn about the Balinese custom and the daily life of the people of Bali. The villagers will welcome you and involve you in daily activities such as working in the rice fields, helping in the primary school and meeting the children (the school is closed on Sundays, national holidays and school holidays)

Lunch in the village.

After lunch, departure to **Samur via Tanah Lot** (the temple of the sea). Tanah Lot means "Land of the Sea" in Balinese. Located in the Kabupaten of Tabanan about 20 km from Denpasar, it stands on an islet beaten by the waves of the ocean

The Tanah Lot is said to be the work of Nirartha, a 15th century priest. Legend has it that he discovered this beautiful rocky islet during a trip and settled there. Fishermen who saw him would have brought him presents. After spending the night there, Nirartha would have judged this place to be suitable for the worship of the sea god and would have asked the fishermen to build a sanctuary there

The temple of Tanah Lot thus built became a reference in Balinese mythology. It is one of the seven temples of the sea of Bali. These seven temples are built along the coast in such a way that the next one can always be seen from the previous one. They are all Hindu style.

Dinner at a local restaurant and overnight at the hotel.

DAY 7

LOMBOK

Breakfast at the hotel.

Transfer to the port of Bena. Crossing of 2h30 by fast boat to reach the port of Teluk in Lombok.

Lunch in town

Discovery of, an amazing island of diversity, wild landscapes, rice fields and plantations, original crafts.

Visit of Mataram, capital of the island: the museum of Nusa Tenggara in the west, the Mayura palace, the royal palace Narmada and the Balinese temple of Lingsar, unique of its kind. Hindus, Buddhists and Muslims pray there together in perfect harmony.

Breakfast at the hotel

Day dedicated to the sea and the discovery of the sea bed around the 3 Gili islands: Air, Meno and Trawangan located north-west of Lombok. Lined with coconut or pine trees, they offer heavenly beaches and beautiful seabeds.

Lunch in a local restaurant

Direction **the north of the island of Gili Trawangan**, one of the best places for snorkeling. Clear, shallow waters, colourful coral reefs and a multitude of tropical fish.

Continuation to **Gili Air Island**

Return to the hotel at the end of the afternoon

Dinner and overnight at the hotel





Bhanuswari Ubud

Bhanuswari Resort & Spa is located in Bali and overlooks Petanu River. The resort offers free Wi-Fi, an outdoor infinity pool, spa and free shuttle services from Ubud.

Bali Taman Lovina

CUSTOMS FORMALITIES

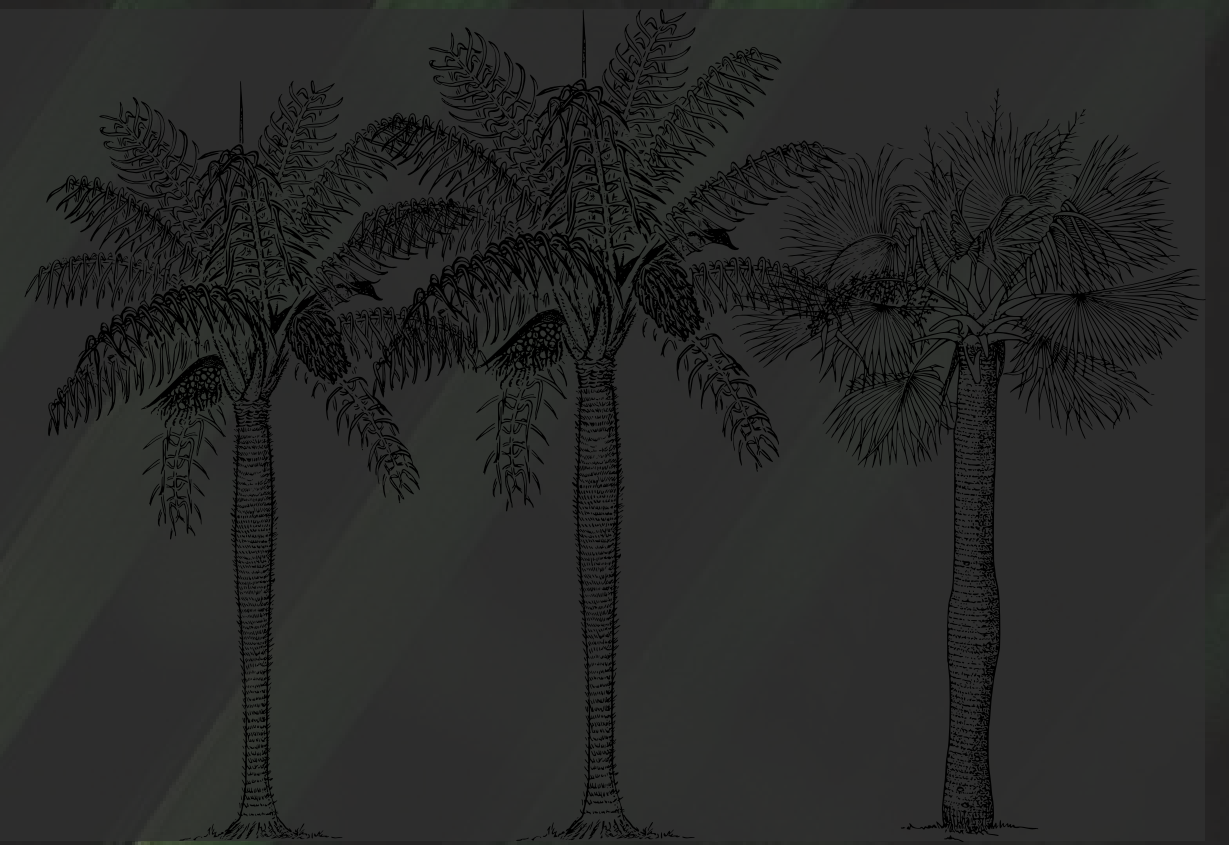
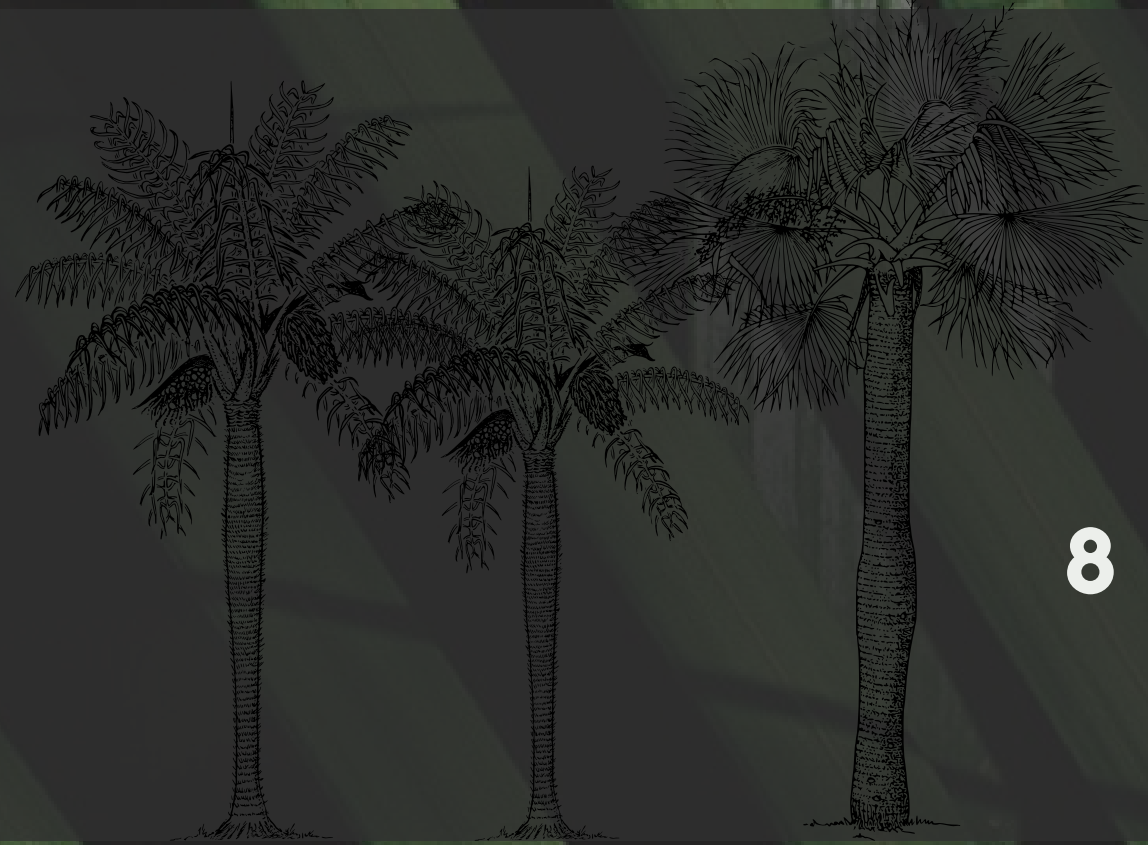
The cost of this visa on arrival in Indonesia is \$35 for a visa of more than 30 days and is renewable once for an additional 30 days, provided you have at least one free page in your passport. It is recommended that you carry the extra money with you (in US dollars) to avoid an unfavorable exchange rate or the currency not being returned to you.

Please note that the Indonesian authorities require that the passport expiry date be 6 months from the date of entry into Indonesia, otherwise there is a risk of being turned back at the border. Travellers should also ensure that their passports contain sufficient blank pages for the visa to be affixed.

The Indonesian authorities require the presentation of a return or exit ticket from Indonesian territory.

HEALTH FORMALITIES

Up-to-date diphtheria-tetanus-polio vaccination is recommended.
